Description of bird: The size, shape, brown color, and white face identified the birds as female scaup. Both birds had smoothly rounded heads, not peaked like Lesser Scaup. One of the birds continually raised its wings to show a white stripe on the wing that extended onto the primaries. Both birds seemed to have larger, heavier bills than Lesser Scaup. The birds were not seen with Lesser Scaup, although we saw about twenty Lesser Scaup an hour earlier.

Similar species and how eliminated: Lesser Scaup eliminated above.

Viewing conditions and equipment: Viewing conditions were good with the sun mostly behind us. Estimated viewing distance was about 75 yards. We used a Buschnell 20-45x spotting scope.

Previous experience with species: I have seen numerous Greater and Lesser Scaup in Iowa, as well as many Greater Scaup in Massachusetts.
