The bird had a dark bill that appeared to come up onto the fall. Face was white
there was a whitish ear smulge on head.
Head was rounded, but more accurately, smoothly curved. LESSET had rougher
hend lines - peaked and an abrupt cutoff at back of head. Greater's lines were
smooth from base of bill, over crown, on over through nape.
In flight The Greater showed white on the upper sarface of wing that
txtended from secondaries well into primaries. White on upper wing sarface of LESSEr'scase was confined to secondaries only.
This bird was just north of the sest area, we matched other scamp females at the vest area that fit the above size and head pattern. On one of these birds the extended white on uffer surface of wing was noted. The other birds did not fly.
