BIRDS: DUCUMENTATION OF UNUSUAL RECORD

HOODED MERGANSER (1)

Location: Willow iSlough, Anderson Twp., Mills Co., Iowa.

Date: June 4, 1978 Late evening.

Description: Very dark, rather small duck. Head unpatterned. Bill thin, yellow.

Behavior: Duck spends much time peering underwater like a loon looking for food. Dives.

Habitat: Lake, out near the middle, where there ware tops of drowned weeds sticking out of the waster.

Similar species: Only mergansers have thin bills (of the ducks, that is)m. Only Hooded mergansers have yellow bilds or unpatterned heads. Shape and bill color eliminate the grebes. Size eliminates the loons. I really me can't think of anything else it could be.

Distance: It was maybe a third of the way across the lake. 80 yds? (A rough guess)

Optical equipment: 20/40x telescope.

Light: It was late and the sun low, but it did shine ton this duck, though nearer parts of the lake were shadowed by the dike. Sky clear, bright. The duck was east of me while the sun was west.

No other observers who could identify this duck.

No books.

The parts under description and behavior were quoted from my notes taken while I could still see theduck.
