The bill was interesting because it had a bright yellow tip and was dark art the last 3 of the base of the bill. On another time of looking at the bill, the bill was yellow on most of the lower mandible only on one side. It had heavy streaking on the head and neck. The legs appeared grayish in the morning and in the afternoon they looked light pinkish and grayish. The bird had real dark upper wings that were edged in white. The underwings where whitish with a large dark wedge at the primary tips of dark gray and blackish at the tips.
