Overall this bird was approximately the size of a blue jay but much more slender with a long tail. It flew stealthily through the trees and landed in a tree in front of me. I identified it immediately as a cuckoo. It was plain white underneath, contrasting with the brown upper body, wings and tail. There were no markings on the wings and my angle precluded seeing the underneath tail pattern. The bill was black and the red eye ring was noted. The bird did not call. This would appear to be a record early date for a black-billed cuckoo.

Similar species and how eliminated:

Yellow-billed Cuckoo - Was eliminated because of the black bill, red eye ring and lack of rust on wings

Did anyone disagree or have reservations about identification? NA

If yes, explain:

Viewing conditions: give lighting, distance (how measured), and optical equipment: Excellent light with sun at back. I would guess the bird was about thirty feet high in the tree and approximately fifty feet away. Seen through 7x26 binoculars.
