Also mention voice and behavior.  The bird was obviously a godwit. It was a very large shore wid-begger than a greater yellowlegs. It downfold two sanderlings that were near it. The outstanding characterist was the very long slightly apturned bill. The bill was yellowish from the base out to about laits length and then dark the rest of the way. All length was at least 3x length of head.  The overall coloration was buffy brown. Faint horizontal streakings (marbling) could be seen on the breast. A light line was noted just above the eye.  The eye was dark.  The legs were fainly long and were dark.  The bird was resting on a sand kar so were could not see the rump. When Ross approached too close it move off and raised its wings to fly.  The rump was boffy brown and the wing lineings were reddish (cinnemon).
Similar species and how eliminated: Hudsonian Godwit would have had a white rump Hudsonians would also be grayer if in winter plumage and rustyer red if in spring.

Viewing conditions: give lighting, distance (how measured), and optical equipment:  We viewed in bright sun from about 125 yd. with 25 x scope and Ross approached  To within 30' before bird moved off.  Previous experience with species and similar ones: I have seen 2 other Marbled Godwits and  quite a few Hubension's in content + spring plumage.
