Approx. 25-30 birds were observed scampering & making short irratic flights in the v cinity of mudflat/water pool area habitat. Upon closer examination (with spotting scopes), birds of 2 sizes were seen, the larger being identified as pectoral sandpipers Amajority (~20) of the birds were smeller a the following field marks noted on several but not all of the individuals:

1) long body appearance - wings extending well beyond tail tip.

- 2) buffy streaking on upper breast & throat; light belly & undertail
- 3) buffy rather than grayish dorsal coloration, pale feather edges.
- 4) dark/black legs
- 5) In flight, showed dark rump & no hint of wing stripe
- 6) Picking feeding habits, not probing most feeding on mudflat not in H20.

Similar species and how eliminated: sanderling: no noticeable wing stripe in flight white-rumped: dank rump when in flight least : dank legs, long tail/wing Western - long tail/wing, no droop in bill tip; no probing Did any one disagree or have reservations about identification? No
