Six were observed swimming and diving frequently on the open water of Diamond Lake. The light gray patches on the checks and extending partly down the neck was evident on 5 of the 6. The sixth bird was all dark , including the bill. Noticed the light gray underbelly on one while it was precining also the black feet and legs. The eyes on all six were dark. A fiel-billed Grebe suom with them briefly and appeared much smaller than these ducks. Observed no white on the wings of any of these 6 ducks.
Similar species and how eliminated: White-winged Scoter - No white on wing - or small patches of white markings on head Ruddy duck = much larger then Ruddy - although did see one lift tail like a ruddy. Did any one disagree or have reservations about identification? If yes, explain: Viewing conditions: give lighting, distance (how measured), and optical equipment: Excellent lighting = we had spotting scopes to observe these ducks for a long period of time (60 minutes) They swam within 20 yards (estimated).
