Also mention behavior and voice. This bird was a shorebird feeding with three killdeer. It had a rather lean body with long, yellow/orange legs which made it taller than the killdeer. Body size was about the same as the killdeer. The bill was just slightly longer than the length of the head. Bill size and body size led to the identification as a lesser yellowlegs.

Similar species and how eliminated:

The long, yellow/orange legs eliminated most other shorebirds. In order to differentiate from the greater yellowlegs, I compared body size to the killdeer with which it was feeding and the bill size to the head. Both field marks eliminated the greater and confirmed the lesser.
