Description of bird: The bird was swimming with a small group of Bufflehead. It was about 1/3 larger than them and was a uniform dull brown except for two white spots on the face, one in front of and one behind the eye. When the bird flew a short distance once, I was able to see that the wings were dark. The bill was much larger and heavier looking than that of a Bufflehead.

Similar species and how eliminated: White-winged Scoter eliminated by lack of white wing patch. Black Scoter eliminated by bill shape and lack of a large white cheek patch.

Viewing conditions and equipment: Estimated viewing distance was 40-50 yards under excellent conditions. I used a Buschnell 20-45x scope.

Previous experience with species: I have seen several Surf Scoters in Iowa including an individual at the same location last year.
