Description of bird: Flying below dam. Overall plain light brown. Underparts all same color except for silvery flight feathers extending to tip of wing. Upper wing with very slight window effect and perhaps a little darkening of outer 1-2 primaries. Body same color as wing. Tail with dark broad tail band -- about distal half.

Voice: Not heard.

Similar species: I looked at many variable first-winter Herring Gulls today. All had more dark on wing tip and darker tail band. This bird was easy to pick out over and over again.

Light: Sun behind me.; Distance: 150 to 500 yards; Optics: 10x binocular (150 yards), 20x scope (500 yards). Previous experience: Have seen many.
