## Description:

A small duck, much smaller than Ring-billed Gull in direct comparison, and slightly shorter in length with a much smaller head than Common Goldeneye in direct comparison. Head mostly white, with a dusky crown [the dusky gray color also extended down the back of the head], and a rather thick slightly diagonal black mark in the lower cheek area below the eye and just above the neck. Bill shiny dark black for basal two-thirds and bright pink for distal one-third. Eye dark. Throat white. Upper breast tannish gray, smudgy. Lower breast and belly white. Mantle dark gray ish, with long pale gray to whitish scapular feathers. Wings entirely dark [reported by AG]. Tail on this bird not the "pintail" seen in breeding plumage.

## Behavior:

Swimming, occasionally diving with wings held slightly open just before submerging. With Common Goldeneye. As I watched the bird swam from the Nebraska side across the lake into Iowa.

Similar species: Small size, whitish head, black and pink bill, dark body distinguishes this bird from all other diving ducks.
