A Yellow-legs (Greater) sized shorebird but without the streaky look of the head and neck or the fine contrasting fleck pattern in the back and wings. These birds were a more nondescript gray-brown with little patterning or contrast to the heavier body. The contrasting black and white wing pattern was clearly evident as one bird flapped while standing. Bill was smaller than that of the yellow legs that were also present nearby.

Similar species and how eliminated: No other shorebird of this area has the Willet underwing markings combined with the uniformly drab body.

Did any one disagree or have reservations about identification?
All above named birders agreed on the identification.
If yes, explain:

Viewing conditions: give lighting, distance (how measured), and optical equipment:

Good sunlight was from south east. View was unobstructed from about 30 yards to the west. Identification was obvious with naked eye and confirmed with binoculars and Kowa TSN4 scope from car.

I have seen the species yearly in Iowa; also in Florida and California.
