Also mention voice and behavior.  A large hawk (near size of Red-tail) was observed soaring about 175 to 250 feet above three observers. The bird appeared to be long-tailed with Short (Compaved to Red tail) wings. The bird appeared much more heavily built than a Cooper's Hewk. Only the under parts were noted; Uniform light gray on all of throat, chest, belly, with a distinct white crissum contrasting with lower belly and tail. Wings were also uniformly colored with no wrist mank on Black or darking at tips. Primaries were not fingered. Tail was long and slightly wedge-shaped and had dull gray and darkers gray banding. The flap was shallow and stiff untike any Buteo and much slower than the cooper's Hawk.

Similar species and how eliminated: Buteos; rather long tail short wings. Uniform gray under parts Cooper's Hawk: Too large, gray, and flapped to slowly.
