The Cinnamon Teal was unmistakeable being in full male breeding near the plumage and lacking the white crescent on the face, Body plumage rump was bright cinnamon stored in Contrast to the brown mottled appearance of the accompanying male Blue-wings. the One, bird with the group was possibly a hybrid having the bright Cinnamaceous plumage along the sides but the back was similar to a typical Blue-wing. The head was also cinnamon to and but had a faint white crescent on the face. I did not see a White mark near the rump. Similar species and how eliminated: Blue-wing males were seen with it.
