A small to medium sized howk w/ rapid, easy flight was flushed. My first impression was Kestrel appearance. On examining the perched bird, the following was noted. Rather stout, bulky body compared w/ Kestrel, also linear dimensions seemed greater than those of Kestrel. Dark crown contrasted by narrow, lightcolored superciliary. Small dark bill w/ yellow cere. Bold brown breast streaking, dark brown back. Boldly barred tail extending approx I inch beyond wings. talcon face pattern limited to indistinct black verticelly-oriented blotch in front of + below the eye. Seen in flight, from side, two more times. Wings were broad compared to Kestrel but obviously pointed. On the perched bird wings also appeared pointed. large Similar species and how eliminated: Kestrel-size, bold breast streaking, lack of distinct facial pattern, absence of rust-brown coloration. Starp-shinned/cooper's - pointed wings, relatively short tail - 1" beyond wingtips, indistintfalcon tacial Did any one disagree or have reservations about identification?
