We had just put our glasses on a Great Horned Owl that had land in a medium sized conifer when suddenly and out of nowhere a rapter appeared in the field of view and swooped very close to the owl. The owl cowered as this bird took a pass at it. The raptor fanned its wings and took off out of sight.
The raptor had long-medium wide wings. The tail was extremely long. The entire upper surface was a solid dark blue-grey color. The bird was easily as big in appearance as the Great Horned Owl. This glimpse was very brief.
The owl had clearly been intimidated by the raptor. We quickly approached the scene of the encounter but we could not see the raptor. A few minutes later we heard a loud burst of "cak-cak-cak-cak", from a nearby hillside. The notes were sharply staccato, and strong and deep. XMIXXXXXXIX MAXX
We heard only this one burst of call notes, and did not see the bird again.
We felt this was a very brief glimpse, but evidence seems to suggest this species
Note: After reference to several books and listening to call notes on Peterson record, this call is very consistent with Goshawk.
Similar species and how eliminated:
Size(large as Great Horned Owl) eliminates Cooper's Hawk.
