We were watching shorebirds when we noticed many of the shorebirds were flying rapidly around in circles. Just then someone spotted a large hawk about 30 yards away over the water turning in the wind. The bird then flow right over our car about 20 feet above our car. It was larger than a crow with definite pointed falcon wings, flow very fast, and had a dark helmet and sideburns. I yelled "Peregrine" as it flow right over the front windshield of the car and all four of us bailed out of the car to watch it quickly fly north over a ridge and disappear. The bird had a dark back and was light underweath.

Similar species and how eliminated: A Merlin is considerably smaller and lacks the heavy black sideburns. A Prairie Falcon shows distinctive black axillaries which we did not see and narrower facial markings. Did any one disagree or have reservations about identification? No

Viewing conditions: give lighting, distance (how measured), and optical equipment: Sunny and clear with strong south winds. Sun was at our side and then at our backs. Distances estimated. 8x30 Binoculars.
