We had been birding Riverton about I to 1/2 hours when I saw a large hawk flying low over the East side of the area from a point North of the main Like. It was flying against the wind, which was blowing at about 25 to 35 mph. with gusts up to 45 mph. It bird had a very shallow wing beat as it flew into the wind and moved at an amasing speed against a head wind that strong. It had a falconlike flight with shallow strong wingboa with a rowing type of wing beat. The bird had a tail that tapered from with a rowing type of wing beat.
