A large rail coming in and out of the vegetation, then two, three, and eventually five were seen at one time. The young (3) were seen first and showed light under parts including the front of the neck. The lightness of the underparts on the adults was less noticeable. Even the young, who were about adult sized, dwarfed adult Kildeer, which were able to be compared side by side.

Similar species and how eliminated: Size ruled out Virginia and Sora. Other large rails have dark uderparts on young birds.

Did any one disagree or have reservations about identification? All above named birders agreed on the identification. If yes, explain:

Viewing conditions: give lighting, distance (how measured), and optical equipment:

Light was behind us. View was unubstructed from about 60-75 yards with Kowa TSN-4 20x-60x spotting scope.

Previous experience with species and similar ones:

I had seen King Rail at Green Island this year, and Clapper Rails in California last year. Randy knew King Rails as common breeders in Texas. Jim and Chuck Fuller have both seen many species of rails.

References and persons consulted before writing description:

<u>National Geographic, Peterson's</u>, and <u>Audubon</u> field guides were used on the spot to rule out descriptions of the young of any other large rails.
