- 1. I first heard the bird call twice. Its bugling call is unmistakable and I have heard them before in Wisconsin and Florida. After the second call, it registered with me what it was and I looked for the bird.
- 2. The bird was circling over corner of lake, about 100 yards up and some distance off. I got glasses on it and then spotting scope. The bird was very large, obviously much larger than any of the ducks I had been watching in flight. It had long legs trailing behind it and the long neck was outstretched in front. It had a relatively long thin bill that gave a slight downward curved view. I didn't look at the bird long as I was trying to show it to the class and it was moving away from us. I had no real impression of any color but the combination of call and silhouette made me immediately positive of my identification. The wings were very broad and the bird had a heavy, labored flight.

Similar species and how eliminated:

Great Blue Heron -saw one later but it flew with neck folded rather than with the cross silhouette of a crane

Viewing conditions: give lighting, distance (how measured), and optical equipment:

Conditions were very heavily overcast. I estimated it was 250-300 yaads away. I got about a 10 second view with a 20 X scope and could see the birds shape clearly.
