
DOCUMENTATION FORM for extraordinary bird sightings in Iowa

As I was driving along toward convad, a large dark "hawk" came from behind a large evergreen grove at a farmstead about 50-70 yards away in front of me. I dig for my binoculars and watched it from 100-200 yards away as it soared away from me. There were strong SE winds that morning and it was soaring in a southwesterly direction. This was a big bird and I thought it might be a turkey vulture at first until I had better looks at it. As it was soaring away, it was turning around and I had good looks at both top end under sides of bird several times.



Similar species and how eliminated: A dark-phase Rough-legged Hawk has lots of white on the underwing flight feathers. Immature Bald Eagles show varying degrees of white on wing linings and body. Turkey Vultures show no white on them,
