Size: Easily twice the size of a mourning dove it was chasing  
Massive - thick body - esp. accross chest - I was surprised

Breast+Belly - unstreaked white or grey (no markings)

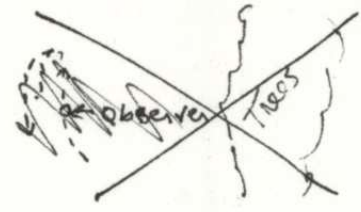
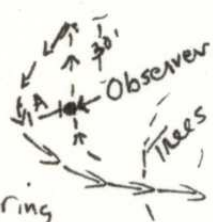
Head - white stripe above eye

Back - dark + rather plain: dark blue or black

General shape: Accipiter, but relative to smaller species was much thicker bodied. Same rounded to wings + long tail as other sp. in genus.

Behavior: Came into view chasing M. Dove (~ 1 meter behind.) The dove at one point rolled and changed directions. This was when the Goshawk appeared to be closing the distance.
