Describe the bird(s) including only what you observed. Include size, shape, details of all parts (bill, eye, head, neck, back, wing, tail, throat, breast, belly, undertail, legs, feet). Also mention voice and behavior.

When bird was first seen flying toward us at a height of about 75 yards, we thought it was a Mourning Dove Honever, the more pointed. wings, long tail, and more powerful minipleats soon identified the bird as a falcon. The bird flew directly over us, made a pass at a sparrow, and then flew back by us again. The bird seemed about the size of an American keitrel, but was perhaps a bit stochier. Upperparts were dark brown. Head also dark brown, no obvious facial pattern. Underports whitish with darker streaks on breast, flanks, and belly. Tail long, brown with lighter barring & tip. Kings fairly long, definishly pointed; brown above, lighter waller neath. Bird flew with deep, powerful wingstrakes, not the more fluttery flight of a kestel. Bird was unguestionably a fimale or immature Merlin.

The small size, lack of any obvious facial pattern, and lack of dark axillars eliminates Pergrim and Prairie Fulcons,

The brown upperforts, barred tail, streaked underparts, and more powerful unjotroker eliminates Am. hestrel.
