location. The silhovette was definately that of a raison sp. 18 was
or light colored enough on the back to be a Frairie talcon and was too large to be
a Merlin. By process of elimination I believe this bird to be a Peregrine Falcon.
Similar species and how eliminated: Prairie Falcon would have been much lighter sandy color than this bird. Merlin would have been smaller.
