Dear Tom,

I hope this report will not be late, but I did want to send you a few notes on the Greater Scaup.

On February 25, Mr. B.J.Rose spotted a Greater Scaup on Boystown Lake in Omaha. This bird was subsequently seen by many observers and all field marks noted.

On Febr. 26, B.J. saw a scaup at the Settling Ponds that he felt was possibly also a Greater Scaup. However, it was a good distance away and light was poor. On February 28, Loren and Babs Padelford saw six scaup there, all with round heads and very white sides. B.J. saw them the next day but on both days light was poor and the birds distant.

Today(March 5) Babs Padelford and I went to the settling Pond and walked to within 200° of the ducks. With 25x Bushnell scopes and sunshine for a change, the broad, untapered bill and rounded heads were quite distinct. Several times we caught glimpses of the greenish shemn on the heads of the males. sides were clear white and the backs pale gray. The Scaup did not fly, but one did flap his wings -- allowing us to the white wing stripe extending into the primaries. There were 5 males and two females. No Lesser Scaup were seen. Other ducks asing the Settling Pond at this time are Common Goldeneye, Bufflehead, Ring-necked Ducks and one pair of Canvasback. The Scaup seem to stay together -- not mixing with the other divers.

Mr. B.J.Rose is Regional Supervisor of Ducks Unlimited; coauthor of The Birds of South Dakota; and an accomplished bird photographer. He is very good, especially on waterfowl.

As you can see from my report, we didn't get into Iowa too much this winter. Sorry: A rather slow winter after a good beginning. Snowy Owls and Snow Buntings at Branched Oak Lake near Lincoln, Nebr. were perhaps the highlights of the season.

Janya Bray P.S. B.J. feels that the early date of open water (about 3 weeks to a month before usual) may have something to do with the greater incidence of Greater Scaup.
