with them, It first I thought it might be a Red-tailed Hawk but the flight
Pattern and silhouette were not right. It was easy to see that the raptor had a light colored breast and belly without a belly band. The wings were
falcor like and pointed. The fail was wedge shaped from the base to the
tip with the base widest. It appeared to have black on the side of the
head. The bird did not have black axillaries they were a lighter color. The
above characteristics, taken together, makes me believe that this bird was a
Peregrine Falcon.
