He was mottled brown on back with a heavy white eye stripe and a darker cap developing. He was heavier like a hawk, with a stockier head. He flew off low between houses in a swoop. Tail was thick & slightly round. He sat with his back to me.

## Similar species; how eliminated:

Red-tailed hawks live close here - I've had them in my backyard also - this one hunted different - acted different.

Cooper hawks come through here quite often - this one was larger, thicker, tail was equal to wings not longer.
