We were on the West side of the South cooling pold and noticed a very large shore bird sitting just out of the water. After setting up the tex scopes we could see it was a Godwit but were not absolutely share which one. Ross walked down to flush the bird to make sure. When he got to within about 50 feet of the bird it raised its wings and the cimnamon wing linings could be seen. When it raised its wings we could also see that it did not have a white romp as the Undsonian Godwit would have, in winter plunes ge. The birds size was wery large for a shore bird with an overall buffy groy color. The back was mottled with white spotts and there was a very faint thin barring on its breast and belly and florks. The bill was very long, about 12 the birds is length, and was black on the front half of the bill and a lighter brown color on the upper half toward the base of the bill. The bird had long, slender, darke legs. the bill also was slightly upward torned or recurved.

Similar species and how eliminated: Hudsonian Godwit has a white rump patch, this bird did not. Hudsonian does not have the Cinnamon colored wing linings like this bird had.
