Description of bird:Both birds were swimming with three Ruddy Ducks and about twenty Mallards. The birds were about the same size as the Mallards and were entirely dark except for a distinct white throat patch. Both birds had dark bills. When the birds flew we could see that the wings were entirely dark.

Similar species and how eliminated: Other scoters eliminated by the dark wings and the distinct throat patch.

Viewing conditions and equipment: Viewing conditions were good, except the birds were a long way off. Estimated viewing distance was about 400 yards. I used a Buschnell 20-45x spotting scope.

Previous experience with species: I have seen one other Black Scoter in Iowa (Nov 1986) and thousands in Massachusetts.
