As the bird flew past our location at about 30 to to gards the white speculum and white tear-trop shaped spot just be hind its eye could easily be seen. The rest of the bird was a uniform Black all over. The birds bill appeared either a bright pink or orange color. I did not see its legs or feet. No voice was heard.
