Similar species; how eliminated:
The bird was clarken than a Kestral with no rust orblue on upper surfaces, darlier below. It didn't bounce, flutter, or glide (or wander) as a Kestral does,
ospecially in a light breeze. The dark back half of the tail was different than
the Kestral's light one, and it was thicken + shorter. Kestral's always remind me of a Killdeer, this bird didn't remotely bring one to mind.
