

Bird was flying toward me; it was quickly recognized by size flight pattern and pointed wings. The bird then turned and flew along side the truck that we were traveling in. Here, the bird was at good vantage. I could clearly see: pointed raptor beak, clear markings on the head, deep blue on back and upper side of bird and brilliant contrasting white underneath. Bird flew typically of falcon flight and the long tail was quite noticeable.

**Similar species and how eliminated:** Larger than crow, but not as heavily winged or banded as Goshawk. Bird was definitely larger than Kestrel or Merlin.
