The, back was light brown while the wings were a little darker brown colored. The bird raised one of its mings once, and I was able to see that the entire underwing was dark. The bill was dark and very stubby. The bord was probably a female because it lacked # flong streamers on the fail. Similar species and how eliminated: All other ductes eliminated by the small size, largely white head and body, dark wings, and stubby bill.
