DETAILS OF IDENTIFICATION

Yellow-throated Flycatcher: On Sept. 2 at the Croton Unit of Shimek State Forest, Lee County, Iowa, I observed a Yellow-throated Flycatcher. The bird was inside mf a thicket of unidentified shrubs bordering an opening in a middle maturity deciduous woodland. A small stream(flowing) is located some 50' away. The bird showed a dull yellow on the undersides, from the belly clear up the throat to the lower mandible. Although the yellow was dull, it was unmistakably yellow, in what I felt was an obvious contrast to the faint hint of a yellow wash of the Acadians in the area. Most of the empidonax sp. I have seen this fall have shown no yellow at all. Also conspicuous about this bird was the yellowish eye ring. Again, this contrasts with the whitish or eggshell color of mathematical color of states.

The bird remained within the canopy of the thicket, occassionally darting out, then returning. This behavior is different that other empids I have observed, which seem to utilize a more exposed perch.
