Description of bird: a fairly large duck, almost as large as several nearby Common Mergansers. Entire body was a dull brownish color. As the bird preened and dove, I could not see any color on the wings. The bird had two conspicuous white patches on the cheek; one in front of the eye and one behind. The bill was much larger and heavier than a Common Mergansers, and was all dark.

Similar species and how eliminated: other scoters eliminated by the white spots on the cheek and the lack of a wing patch.

Viewing conditions and equipment: light was excellent with the sun behind me and partly obscured by clouds. Estimated viewing distance was 100-200 yards. I used a 20x spotting scope.

Previous experience with species: I have seen Surf Scoters in Iowa and on the east coast several times.
