Bird approximately the size of an American Crow. View was that of back and right side of the face. Dorsal coloring appeared gray in color. View of face showed a hooked upper mandible dark in color. Face was patterned: broad, black-appearing eye band, whitish superciliary line above the blackish eye band and a blackish crown. Tail extended beyond tips of primaries with bottom edge hidden from view. Bird made no calls during time seen.

Similar species; how eliminated:

Cooper's hawk eliminated by lateral face pattern Sharp shinned hawk eliminated by size Osprey eliminated by tail length in relation to primaries

Because tip of tail not seen and no view of ventral side
