After Mark alerted me to the scoter, Phyllis, Ramona + I hurried to the lake. The bird was no longer in the same area of the lake, nor were the Hooded Mergansers it had been with. In driving around & scanning the lake from different spots we found the Hooded Mergansers, but no scoter. After walking to a point Phyllis finally saw a lone dark kird. Before we could focus a scope on it a small flock of Canada Geese took off, & this bird too. As it flew past us we saw the brown, chunky, short-necked

bird with large head sloping to the bill, white secondaries, and two conspicuous white facial patches - a White-winged Scoter, most likely an immoture. It headed south away from the lake, and out of sight.

Similar species and how eliminated: as we saw it fly with white wing patches a distinct white facial spots there was nothing else to confuse with it.
