I looked up, and 3 shore birds were searching the mud at the edge of the reeds about 15 yoks beyond the flock. They were taller than the peeps, with longer legs (lighter colored them semipalmateds black legs) and longer necks. They had so dark backs, lighter so whitish below. The light eyering was very evident on all 3 birds. They did not associate with the peeps of react to them at all. I looked set at the flock of peeps inomentarily, when I looked back, they were gone. I did not see them in flight, or hear them.

Similar species; how eliminated:

They did not have the yellow legs of the yellow hegs. The eye ring is definately the mark of the solitary.
