Several of the birds approached quite closely allowing inspection of the of the bill which was wider and rounder than that of Lesser. The swimming bird's also had much whiter sides than the duller colored male Lesser Scaups. The Greater lacked the purple Iridescence and showed a greenish color to head. In flight and when stretching the birds revealed white extending well into the middle primary feathers.
