Also mention voice and behavior while watching gulls behind the dam at Keokuk, I noted a much smaller gull that was immediately evident as a winter plumaged, adult Bonaparte's Gull. Features noted included light gray mantle with narrow leading wing edge, and white narrow wedge on forewing. Underparts white, tail white, head whitish. Bill dark. Underwings similar in coloration to upper surface—not darker. Overall size, perhaps 2/3 the size of accompanying Ring-bills. No sounds were noted, nor did I note feet/leg color
Similar species; how eliminated: Common Black-headed has dark underwings. I would have noticed this.
Did any one disagree or have reservations about the identification? N.A. If yes, explain:
Viewing conditions: give lighting, distance (how measured), optical equipment. Viewing conditions excellent—sun to left 90°. Partly cloudy. Optics: 20x Nikon Scope Distance, perhaps 100 to 200 yards. Previous experience with species and similar ones: Have seen lots of Bonaparte's in all plumages. Have not seen Common Black-headed.
