We were watching sharp-shinned, cooper's, and Broad-winged Hawks on a ridge above the Iowa River. They often would pop into view coming over the trees in front of us or just over a slight rise of lend. One bird that came into view was a large falcon which came right toward us. It was a large falcon with heavy dark sideburns and a charcoal gray back. It was 15-20 yards away or closer and was 20 feet high over the ground as it cleared the spruces and pines behind us. The sun was behind us and we had a good, brief look at this magnificent falcon.

About half on how later another large falcon followed almost the same flight path of the first Peregrine. It was 15-18 yards away and 18-20 feet above the pines. It really zipped past us. It was a large falcon that flapped constantly and had dark sideburns. It was lighter in color than the other Peregrine and had a light gray brown back.

Similar species and how eliminated: A Merlin is much smaller and lacks the heavy black sideburns of a Peregrine.
