Describe the bird: Observed in flight only as bird left protection of barn and seemed to want back in! Noticed long pointed wings and long tails distinctive of falcons, light brown color on back with cream colored breast which was heavily spotted, saw narrow mustaches

Underwing pattern showed dark axillaries and wing coverts (black in the wingpits)

Similar species and how eliminated: MORE BROWN THAN PEREGRINE FALCON, BOTH FEMALE MERLIN AND PEREGRINE FALCON LACK UNDERWING PATTERN OBSERVED IN THIS BIRD

Did any one disagree or have reservations about identification? NO

Viewing conditions: EXCELLENT LIGHTING UNDER PARTLY CLOUDY CONDITIONS, BLOWING SNOW HAD BEEN A PROBLEM EARLIER IN THE DAY BUT HAD LET UP CONSIDERABLY AT THIS TIME, PRAIRIE FALCON FLEW TOWARDS US OUT OF BARN BESIDE THE ROAD AND WE WERE PARKED APPROXIMATELY 300' FROM THE BARN, CONTINUALLY FLEW IN THE AREA AT TIMES BEING DIRECTLY OVERHEAD WITH FIELD MARKS DISTINCT EVEN WITHOUT BINOCULARS, USED 7 X 35 BINOCULARS AT TIMES

Previous experience with species and similar ones: HAVE NEVER OBSERVED PRAIRIE FALCON BEFORE, BUT HAVE OBSERVED PEREGRINE FALCON IN WISCONSIN
