Similar species and how eliminated: No other duck shows the combination of a dark body, a white cheek patch, and dark wings lacking speculums.

Viewing conditions and equipment:Estimated viewing distance was 50-75 yards and light was excellent. I used Nikon 8 x 23 binoculars and a Buschnell 20-45x scope.

Previous experience with species: I have seen all three species of scoters on the east coast, but only White-winged and Surf in Iowa.
