the three birds were swimming parallel to shore as I sat in my car and did not spook as I watched them. They swam broadside to me for some time as I watched with first my binoculars then my e90 telescope. The sun shining on their heads made them look like they had green heads at first. They had very rounded heads and appeared quite a bit lighter to gray on the back and sides that other scaup that I was used to seeing. There were rot any Lesser Saup close to compare size with these birds. I opened the door of my car to get a better view of them as they swam further away and they flew and I could see that the white in the secondaries continued quite aways into the primaries; almost to the tips of the primaries. With all these characteristics taken together it would mean that these birds were Greater Scaup. No voice was heard.
Similar species and how eliminated: Lesser Scaup has a purple sheen to the head at close range under the viewing conditions present when these birds were seen. Lesser Scaup has a more pointed look to the top of the head and does not show the white

in the primaries in flight.
