Description of bird: I was looking over some Bonaparte's Gulls near Jester Park when I saw a first-winter Black-legged Kittiwake. The bird lacked a dark half collar and was presumably the same bird I found on 29 Nov. I continued looking over more Bonaparte's Gulls and was quite surprised to find another kittiwake. At first, I thought I was looking at the same bird, but closer examination revealed that this bird had a very obvious black collar across the back of the head. I watched both of the birds as they fed with Bonaparte's Gulls over the next hour or so. Other than the differences in the half-collar, both birds were pretty much identical.

Similar species and how eliminated: The size, wing pattern, forked tail, and dark tail band eliminate all other gulls.

Viewing conditions and equipment: Viewing conditions were good with the sun behind me. Estimated viewing distance was as close as 50 yards. I used a Buschnell 20-45x spotting scope.

Previous experience with species: I have seen hundreds of Black-legged Kittiwakes off Massachusetts, plus about three other individuals in Iowa, including two this fall.
