To my right I noticed a Goldfinch and using my binos, with the sun behind me, I noticed a black bill, dark eye, dark brown to black usings. The bird was about 50 yds. From me and 25 ft over the ground. The cheek, lores, forehead, nape of neck, throat, breat and belly appeared while to light gray. Colving bus uniform. The bird was looking down ward. Toil was black and did not seem to be exceptionally long. Tail was held almost perfendicular to its perch. After approx. 5 mins a car drave part creating a cloud of dust and the bird took flight into a freshly catch they field. Driving up to the spot where it flow from its perch. I Scanned to the west into the hayfield. About I omins, elapsed and I relocated the bird. It was standing on loosely scattered haybart boyds from me. Again I noted how white this bird appeared I It stood motionless for about 30 to 40 seconds and then began to flycatch. Using its usings as a sort of net it was blacking and trapping insects in a cart wheeling motion never getting higher than 3ft off the ground. Wing linings were white, Primary and secondary feathers of underwing were black. After its third fly catching attempt, it brove into full flight traveling north, approx 8ft.  Outside ground Tail was held parallel to the ground, a slight separation in outer tail feathers was blacking my third after a 30 min search, I saw the bird fly into a large deciduous tree. Do to the stan problems in Searching a large tree coupled with strong winds, I did not find the bird.  Searching the area for a bout 2.5 hrs. on I Aug and driving approx I Omiles of country roads during that time;  I did not see the bird again.
