This bird was seen flying above the skim ice above the surface of the backwaters of the reservoir. The flight was that of a swallow; smooth, graceful, fluid. The top of the bird was a blue black color. The underpart showed a rusty ton to cinnamon color. The tail was long and deeply forked. At times the bird landed on the ice or small blanches and wards above the ice. It stayed in a relatively small area during the time of observation.
Similar species and how eliminated: No other smallow has long smallow tail, forked pointed on outer retrices, dark blue-black color on back and medium tanto cinnamon color below.
