I first saw the bird in the company of several hong-billed Downtchers. The bird was almost the same size, but had much shorter legs, a shorter bill, and was overall paler than the downtchers. Although my first reaction was that the bird was a sanderling, the size and grayer back eliminated it as a possibility. I then recognized the bird as being almost identical the the Red knots I saw in 1904 of Humpton, Ill. and at Hendrickson Marsh. The bird was larger than a trilldeer and much chunker. The legs were short and dark, The bill was black, short, and rather thick. It appeared to be the same length as the head. The birds back was gray and each feather & had white edging, giving the bird a scaly look. The wings were also mottled gray, except for black tips to the primaries and a faint white wing stipe, seen when the Food lifted it's wings. The bird, also had a faint white eyestripe, The junderparts were, mostly white, except for some gray	bars,
