A-D, Not totally unexpected this date.

A-D, Coloration and droopy bill good. Early date, or did it ever leave?

A-D, Short, black legs and indistinct supercillium also eliminate Stilt Sandpiper, a less likely candidate. Western Sandpiper's smaller size should have been apparent next to a Killdeer.

A-D, Description matches basic plumage Dunlin. This species winters regularly at one location in Tennessee. Other Jan and Feb records: Jan: WI, IL, KY, KS, TN(2); Feb: OH, TN(2). The earliest migrants are noted for 11 Mar (KS), 24 Mar (IL), and 28 Mar (KY). It seems more likely that this bird over-wintered due to the mild weather. Migrants rarely appear before April.

A-D, Not unprecedented in NE. There is a Jan rec in NE.
